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## JET TUB CLEANING

Clean your hydrotherapy tub when you are moving into a new home, or one that has been vacant for three months or more. The process below generally does a good job of cleaning the scum and oils that build up in the tub plumbing and pump. The process below includes a clean, disinfect and rinse cycle.

	
First fill the jet tub with <b>HOT</b> water.	Make sure that the water level is at least 2 inches above the jets.
	
Add 1/4 cup of granulated dishwasher soap (not liquid) to the hot water.	Turn the jets on and allow them to run for approximately 20 minutes. There may be a ring of scum after draining, wipe this off and rinse it down the drain.



Drain the tub completely.  
There may be a ring of scum around the tub after draining, wipe this off and rinse it down the drain.



Refill the tub with **COLD** water, then add ½ cup of liquid bleach and run the jets for approximately 20 minutes.



Drain the tub completely.  
There may be a ring of scum around the tub after draining, wipe this off and rinse it down the drain.



The purpose of this cleaning is to disinfect and sanitize your tub and plumbing. As described above, you might still need to do some physical cleaning. I recommend a final rinse with cold water prior to use.
